



1	Grip, Right Hand	1
2	Grip, Left Hand	1
3	Adhesive	1
4	M6 x 22mm cap head bolt	2

1 Open the side cover and disconnect the battery, as described in the Owner's Manual.


2 Remove the left hand M6 cap head fixing (1) and bar end weight (2). Repeat on the right hand side.

Retain the bar end weights for reuse.

Discard the fixings and source replacements from a Royal Enfield Spares Dealer if the motorcycle is to be returned to its original condition.



5mm hexagonal bit and ratchet




3 Use a blade to carefully cut and remove the left hand grip from the handlebar.



Blade




Use caution when handling blade to avoid injury



4 Apply the adhesive from the kit to the inside of the left hand grip then slide the grip (1) on to the handlebar (2) ensuring the end of the grip is beyond the end of the handlebar. Clean any excess adhesive from the handlebar with an alcohol spray and shop towel.


Wait a minimum of 3 hours for the adhesive to cure.




5 Remove the 3 fixings shown (1). Disassemble the right hand switchcube (2) from the handlebar. Retain the fixings (1), making note of which screws come from which hole.





6 Disconnect the throttle cable (1) from the grip tube (2). Slide off the throttle grip from the handlebar.



7 Slide the throttle grip (1) from the kit onto the handlebar. Locate the end of the grip in the switch cube and connect the throttle cable (2) to the grip tube (3).




8 Reassemble the right hand switchcube (1) to the handlebar, ensure that the alignment pin in the switch cube fits in to the hole on the handlebar.

Refit the 49mm (2), 29mm (3) and 10mm (4) fixings from Step 5 to the switchcube. Tighten the fixings to **1.75Nm**.





9 Reassemble the bar end weights (1) using the M6 cap head fixings (2) from the kit. Tighten to **10Nm**.




5mm hexagonal bit and torque wrench



10 Reconnect the battery and reassemble the side cover (1), as described in the Owner's Manual.
